

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DALE



Dear Friends,

What an awesome Easter Sunday we celebrated last week! 1290 of Traverse City's finest turned out for our six worship opportunities. The messages and music of the day all declared Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! And what a bonus, the weather was glorious too. Thank you to all who gave their time and energy to make this year's Holy Week and Easter memorable. It would not have been possible without your help.

As with other high moments in the church year, we move on now to new expressions and experiences of God's love. I have a book on my shelf titled: The Seven NEXT Words of Christ. We are all familiar with the seven last words of Christ from the cross. But maybe you didn't know there are also seven sayings by Jesus during the 40 days following his resurrection before his ascension. These are the words Jesus spoke as he encouraged, prepared, and deployed his disciples for ministry to the world. The author writes: "For the disciples, their next steps are uncertain. Their world shattered, their hearts aching, they wondered, why go on at all? But their faith gave them an inner strength, and they knew life must continue. Besides Jesus would have expected no less... Still the echo of his last words rang within them: 'It is finished.' How could they have known that actually it had just begun?" Christ went on to visit the weary wonderers and bolster their faith with words like: Don't be afraid, peace be with you, go into the world and wait for the gift from on high.

The earthquake that shook the ground at that resurrection morn still reverberates today. And the spirit of the Risen Christ continues to encourage, prepare and deploy us for service. There are so many different ways that is happening here at Central. Both well establish and cherished ministries, along with new expressions of resurrection faith, speak of how Christ is alive among us.

The Easter hymn "He Lives" says it well:

"I serve a risen savior, he's in the world today; I know that he is living, whatever foes may say. I see his hand of mercy, I hear his voice of cheer, and just the time I need him, he's always near. He lives, he lives, Christ Jesus lives today! He walks with me and talks with me along life's narrow way. He lives, he lives, salvation to impart! You ask me how I know he lives? He lives within my heart."

You and I are Christ's hands of mercy and voice of cheer today. We share his saving love. That's what resurrection life is all about.

Let us live as Easter people. For he is risen indeed!

THE JOURNEY

Ed (my husband) and I are part of a small group called "The Journey." We came together as progressive Christians, who believe that our faith should reflect our life experiences, not remain rigid and unexamined,

and that our theological and spiritual lives should grow deeper as we mature. We named our group "The Journey" because we believe that faith is not a destination. We are more interested in the reflective path to understanding than in arriving at a final certain dogma.

For several years now, each month we have shared a simple meal together, before our hour of thoughtful discussion that often leads us to more questions than answers. To date, we have viewed two video series, Living the Questions, and Saving Jesus, and together, we have read two books, Adam Hamilton's book, Seeing Gray in a Black and White World, and most recently, Marcus Borg's book, The Heart of Christianity. Some of these studies have then been offered to the whole congregation for study.

We are becoming increasingly more comfortable with our own group's faith diversity and dialogue, and believe that this questioning is essential for the future of the church. Willingness to listen to those with whom we disagree is critical for people of all religions. Openness may help to change the disrespect that separates our world community from experiencing the "Kingdom of God."

RECONCILING MINISTRIES



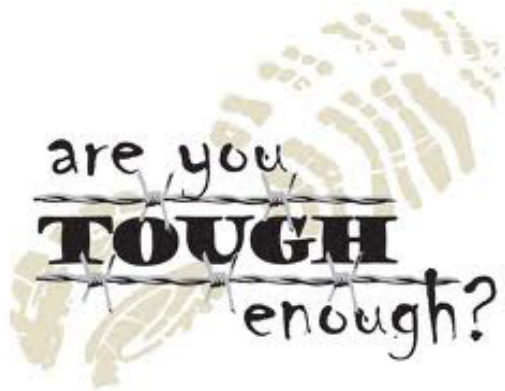
