

# A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DALE

---



**Dear Friends,**

We continue to hear news about climate change and global warming. Due to greenhouse gases which trap heat in atmosphere, the surface temperature of the earth is rising. Typically changes in the earth's climate occur over long periods of time. Yet due to our overuse of fossil fuels we've seen an accelerated climate change. Still, attention to the environment can turn things around. By being good stewards of the earth's resources we can make a difference.

Climate change is an idea that applies to community as well. The Christian Church has been around for more than 2000 years. It has endured climates of schism and war, shifts in leadership and changing doctrines and beliefs. Yet it is still thriving today, building on its past and moving into the future. Why? Because the church is of God, founded on the rock of Jesus Christ and energized by Holy Spirit who gives it life. The good news of the scriptures is that Christ and his church will prevail. Climates come and climates go but the way of the Lord endures forever.

It's good to remind ourselves of this long view of faith. At times it might seem that the climate of our lives has changed for the worse. That our community has gotten off track. Maybe we're not happy with the way things are going. Sometimes change in our lives can cause pain and confusion. When that happens we would do well to remind ourselves that we are in this for the long haul - that God is still God and we are still God's people. And because of this we are committed to Jesus and his church in all times and seasons.

That point of view will bring us through a lot together. It will enable us to see the good in the diverse ideas and various gifts that make up the church. And it will allow us to focus more on what unites us than on what divides us. What "climate changes" have caused you concern? Hold those things up to the light of God's love and let that light illuminate any darkness. Let that light help you make the changes in your own life so that the climate around you will be better for all.

St. Francis said it this way:

*Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love. Where there is injury, pardon. Where there is doubt, faith. Where there is despair, hope. Where there is darkness, light. Where there is sadness, joy. O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled, as to console; to be understood, as to understand; to be loved, as to love. For it is in giving that we receive. It is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to Eternal Life. Amen.*

What a privilege it is to be stewards of this wonderful community. May a climate of radical love and generous giving mark our days in this body of Christ!

## FALL HIGHLIGHTS

# CHILDREN'S CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

## Lessons from a third grader:

*I am always honored when my job allows me to spend time directly with the children of Central. I am consistently impressed with the vastness of their understanding of abstract concepts like faith, inner balance and trust. **They have so much to teach me and a child's perspective can be so enlightening in its simplicity and directness.** I am often left pondering an idea or concept discussed in our casual learning environment.*

*Let me share with you my most recent "ah ha" moment, taught to me by a beautiful little 3rd grader:*

I am attempting to get early elementary students to understand that nothing of the world should come between us and God. God should be the first thing in our lives, and all else should follow; money, friends, family, possessions etc. . . . A difficult concept for any age, but a wonderful student taught me a way to never forget!

Place your fist on top of your heart, and then move your fist out in front of you to be an arms length away. It is that simple; anything you can hold should be an arms length away, God is the only thing that should be close to your heart. So, God close to your heart (fist at the heart), everything else an arms length away (move your fist away from you).

*So when you are feeling chaotic, anxious or your head is spinning as we enter into the holiday season, put your fist to your heart and remember the one true God that will straighten our path if we let him in by removing all the other worldly things that get in the way.*

Central recently sent \$1,530 to help provide water filters for areas in Haiti where safe water is hard to find. They will not be for individual homes but for community water outlets. U.M. volunteer teams will go to help train Haitians in how to use and install the filters. Central's Bill Donberg will go to Haiti in December to observe how the work is progressing.

*Greetings* from the Finance Committee. We wanted to keep everyone up to date as we approach the end of 2011. **With the first 3 quarters of the year completed we are trending well behind budget for our income. This, in spite of lower than budgeted expenses, has resulted in a shortfall for the year of almost \$50,000.** We actually had a very strong August which had narrowed our shortfall materially that month, but September ended up being much softer from an income standpoint which more than doubled the deficit. We are encouraged by strong giving for the first few weeks of October, and are hopeful that this will continue through the balance of the year to reduce or eliminate the deficit.

Thank you for your continued support which allows us to accomplish all of the wonderful work this congregation does.
