

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHRIS



“FAITH IN THE 8th”

Central Church has launched a year-long exploration for 8th graders to know what it means to be a United Methodist Christian. It is called Credo Confirmation class. I feel so positive about this group of seventeen outstanding students in our newly formed group, that I want to take a moment to share our progress. Central has a proud history of taking confirmation class seriously, meeting over a course of months so that students can make & deepen friendship bonds, while considering core concepts in the Christian faith. This year we took on a just-published curriculum, moved our target group from 7th graders to 8th graders, plus we have assembled a larger circle of caring adults to teach and plan activities for the class.

The expectations are pretty ambitious for this eight-month class: 18 sessions, 3 retreats, service projects, field trips, homework, meeting with a mentor, and regular attendance in weekly worship. I am glad to report that when we asked parents & students to sign the Covenant forms in our initial session, no one balked at what was being asked for, and all stepped forward to sign. I believe we all get it, that like so many things in life, when it comes to developing a faith - the greater the investment, the greater the benefit.

Over the course of our sessions students will grapple with the broad themes of Holy Scripture, the tools for living a moral life inherent to our Methodist tradition, and learn the cost behind the vows of membership. We are throwing a lot at these students. Frankly, we try to not make the assumption that all the students will choose to join Central Church at the conclusion of the class, as much as it is our hope that they do. We see the choice to express faith in membership of a church as an important exercise of their own free will. We are confident, however, that the class will equip students with building blocks for developing and deepening a lifelong relationship with God.

We are off to a great start. I wish the entire congregation could have seen these fine young people at our overnight retreat recently, brainstorming and discussing their values as a group. They adopted a group name “**Faith in the 8th**”, created a group motto, and designed an artistic group crest that will be displayed in the church for the year. There are some budding leaders in this group. It is obvious that their parents, teachers, and Sunday School leaders have already done a great job helping these young persons along. We on the leadership team can only imagine great things ahead for these 17 students as they more claim a Christ-centered life, and invest themselves in the life of the Church.

Please pray for them over the coming months, as they meet with mentors, discuss life’s biggest questions, and grow close as a group. Here are their names:

By offering educational options and meeting space to the community at large, we were reaching out to the un-churched and presenting Christianity in a non-threatening way; taking church off the pews and into the community; thus living by our Methodist values of *Open hearts, Open minds, Open doors.*

With such growth, comes responsibility.

With additional programming and offerings, we have set a higher standard for our members. There are so many options to grow in fellowship and spirit here at Central, there is no reason that each member of Central's family can't find a class or activity to take part in OR volunteer in.

Each class needs facilitators--from rocking babies in the nursery, completing a craft at parents night out, coordinating Advent night, leading an adult class or guiding middle school students through curriculum in Sunday school.

CROP WALK 2011

As the economic downturn continues in our country and around the world, we should remember that many of God's children are struggling to put food on the table. You can help them by participating in this year's CROP Walk on Sunday, Oct. 9!

For many years, Central UMC has been Traverse City's leading participant in the CROP Walk, which raises funds to support the hunger relief ministry of Church World Service. Please consider giving just a couple of hours of your time to join our team of walkers. We'll begin at the Grand Traverse County Civic Center at 1:30 p.m. and make our way along a 10-kilometer (6.2-mile) route on tree-lined downtown sidewalks. What's the point of walking? Hungry people in developing countries typically walk as much as 6 miles a day to get food, water and fuel, and to take their goods to market. We walk to be in solidarity with their struggle for survival. We walk because we want to end hunger -- one step at a time.

FROM YOUR PARISH NURSE:

Thank you to everyone who recently signed up to volunteer their services on the Transportation Team. They will be helping the elders of Central get to appointments, therapy sessions, the grocery, or maybe visiting a spouse in a nearby Nursing Facility. Please feel free to add your name to the list if you are called to help with this wonderful labor of love. The sign up sheet is located on the Health Ministry Bulletin Board located across from the main office.

In addition, as our seasons change, cool, rainy days are upon us, please keep this in mind: We have very limited handicap parking at Central. If you are able to walk independently consider leaving the front row parking spaces open for those members who are faced with physical challenges. We now have ushers at the Cass Street entrance to help open the beautiful, but heavy, wooden doors. The Senior High Youth Group will be offering a helping hand for those in need of assistance crossing Cass Street.

And don't forget. . .

Cold and flu season is coming. Frequent, thorough hand washing (warm, soapy water for 20-30 seconds) is the best way to prevent the spread of infection. Flu vaccine is available for everyone over 6 months of age. Talk with your health care provider to find which flu vaccine is right for you.

The CDC is recommending a single dose of the Shingles Vaccination for everyone 60 years and older even if you have had Shingles in the past. The reasoning is that it will decrease severity for repeat cases. This is contradictory to what some physicians and drug manufactures are recommending. Many insurances as well as Medicare D will cover this, check with your carrier prior to receiving the vaccine. Thompson Pharmacy, Rite-Aid on 8th and Garfield, and Walgreen Pharmacy welcome walk-ins, no Dr. order is necessary.
