CONNECTING WITH GOD IN PRAYER

PRAYER OF THE PEOPLE

One: O God of all, we read in the Gospel today how you seek us out like hen seeks out her chicks; that you offer us the protection and safety of your strong wings. Help us have the presence, O God, to listen for your call; to pause and allow you to speak into us; to wait and have your warmth and your wisdom meet us where we are:

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

One: Father and Mother of us all, you have given us many images of what you are like through the law and the prophets and the ministry of Christ. You have been compared to a rock which
